







Exodus 15:22-24






Exodus 15:25


Then Moses cried out to the LORD, and the LORD showed him a piece of wood. He threw it into the water, and the water became fit to drink.

Exodus 15:25-26

There the LORD issued a ruling and instruction for them and put them to the test. He said, 'If you listen carefully to the LORD your God and do what is right in his eyes, if you pay attention to his commands and keep all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for I am the LORD, who heals you.'



The people had brought a lot of Egypt with them - internally. The entire nation had just undergone a seizure of flies, locusts, dead frogs, boils and impure water. In the resulting plague, hundreds of thousands of Egyptian children had died. The Israelites, for the most part, had escaped the plagues. But they still brought with them the contamination of Egypt...



Now at Marah the Lord spoke and told them he would not allow the Egyptian diseases to afflict them - if they but obeyed him. What did God want the Israelites to do? Obviously he wanted them to drink the water of Marah - but it was filled with magnesium. True, but even Moses could not have known about the medicinal qualities of calcium and magnesium.

For one thing, magnesium is a powerful laxative. It was God's way of cleaning out their systems... In the process, they would have expelled most of the amoeba, parasites and death dealing germs they brought with them from Egypt.

Thus their first stop in the wilderness journey was not a place of despair but a place where God had provided medicinal water.

Luke 22:41-44

He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, 'Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done.'
